THE CRUCIFIX

Triumphans vs. Patiens

■ ■	Open eyes Triumphans — Christ victorious, alive, conquering death	Pre-1200s
■	Closed eyes Patiens — Christ dead, suffering completed, humanity emphasized	Post-Franciscan
■	Straight posture Divine power, no submission to gravity	Pre-1200s
■ ■	S-curve slump Weight of death, human body yielding	Post-1240
■	Blood + water From side wound — the Church born from Christ's body	Franciscan
■	Crown Kingship, triumph over death	Triumphans
■	Crown of thorns Suffering, humanity, mockery	Patiens
■	Suppedaneum Footrest — Christ stands on cross, not hangs	Triumphans

THE VIRGIN MARY

Purity & Intercessor

■	Blue mantle Heaven, queenship, divinity (ultramarine = expensive = holy)	Universal
■	Red dress Humanity — divinity (blue) covers humanity (red)	Universal
■	White lily Purity, virginity — watch WHO holds it	Annunciation
■	Iris Sorrow — the sword that will pierce her heart	Renaissance
■	Thornless rose Sinlessness — she alone escapes the thorns	Post-1400
■	Crescent moon Revelation 12 — Woman of the Apocalypse	Immac. Conc.

■	Twelve stars Crown of stars — Revelation 12 imagery	Immac. Conc.
■	Enclosed garden Hortus conclusus — her virginal womb, inviolate	Post-1400
■	Sealed fountain Purity, sealed from sin	Post-1400
■	Open book Reading prophecy of her own future (Isaiah)	Annunciation
■	Closed book Mystery sealed, hidden wisdom	Annunciation

ST. FRANCIS

Founder of the Emotional Script

■	Stigmata Wounds of Christ received — hands, feet, side	Post-1224
■	Three-knotted rope The three vows: poverty, chastity, obedience	Universal
■	Brown/grey habit Poverty — undyed wool, humility	Universal
■	Skull Memento mori — death as teacher	Common
■	Wolf Gubbio legend — taming of the wolf	Narrative
■ ■	Birds Sermon to the birds — all creation as audience	Narrative
■	Nativity scene Greccio 1223 — he invented this	Origin

BOTANICAL SYMBOLS

Renaissance Garden of Meaning

■	Lily Purity, virginity, Annunciation	Universal
■	Iris Sorrow, suffering to come	Renaissance
■	Rose Mary; if thornless = sinlessness	Post-1400
■	Apple Sin (the Fall) — or Christ as 'new Adam'	Universal
■	Grapes Eucharist, wine = blood of Christ	Universal
■	Wheat Eucharist, bread = body of Christ	Universal

■	Pomegranate Resurrection, many seeds = many faithful	Renaissance
■	Cypress Death, but also eternal life (evergreen)	Italian
■	Fig leaves The Fall, covering of shame	Universal
■	Olive branch Peace, reconciliation with God	Universal

COLORS & MATERIALS

The Expensive Theology

■	Gold leaf Eternity, divine realm, outside time	Byzantine+
■	Ultramarine From lapis lazuli — most expensive = most holy	Contracts
■	Vermillion/red Blood, passion, martyrdom, humanity	Universal
■	White Purity, innocence, resurrection	Universal
■	Black Death, sin, penitence (Dominicans)	Universal
■	Brown Poverty, humility (Franciscans)	Mendicants
■	Yellow Treachery (Judas), or divine light	Context

GESTURES & POSES

The Body Speaks

■	Praying hands Supplication, devotion, humility	Universal
■ ■	Pointing up Reference to heaven, divine source	Common
■	Open palm out Blessing, welcome, receiving	Saints
■	Crossed arms Humility, acceptance (Mary)	Annunciation
■ ■	Eyes raised Ecstasy, divine vision, rapture	Baroque
■	Hand to face Grief, lamentation	Giotto+
■	Two fingers Blessing — two natures, divine + human	Byzantine+

**Bare feet**

Humility, poverty, holy ground

CARAVAGGIO'S LANGUAGE

Post-Trent Realism (1571–1610)

After the Council of Trent locked down doctrine, Caravaggio found freedom within the rules.

**Tenebrism**

Deep blacks, single light = divine breaking in

1600s

**Dirty feet**

Christ among the poor, authentic humanity

**Peasant faces**

Saints as ordinary people

**Frozen moment**

Drama caught at peak — before/after implied

Human longing for divine
